

This month, we spotlight the Salvadori Center and Executive Director Trenton Price for their innovative, equity-driven approach to STEAM education.

About the Salvadori Center:

The Salvadori Center brings science, technology, engineering, arts/architecture, and mathematics (STEAM) to life for PreK-12 students —especially those in under-resourced communities. Their projectbased programs use the built environment—buildings, bridges, parks, and neighborhoods—to make STEAM tangible and relevant.

Salvadori partners with schools and after-school centers in NYC and Pennsylvania, including public housing communities, to deliver handson STEAM experiences. Programs are fully equipped with curriculum, instruction, materials, and supplies.

Their approach fosters:

- Teamwork, communication, and critical thinking
- Creative problem solving
- Measurable growth in STEAM knowledge and confidence

Spotlight on Trenton Price:

Since becoming Executive Director, Trenton Price has expanded Salvadori's impact by 40% in just two years. Drawing from his background as a middle school teacher, school leader, and arts education district leader with NYC Public Schools, Trenton has introduced groundbreaking design justice initiatives that center youth empowerment.

Working alongside Deputy Director Malika Khalsa, Salvadori continues to lead the way in delivering high-quality STEAM residencies. Malika, a former Pre-K teacher, brings over eight years of experience at Salvadori, along with leadership roles at City Year New York and the NYC Administration for Children's Services.

We celebrate Trenton Price and the Salvadori Center for their commitment to educational equity and student-driven innovation.


