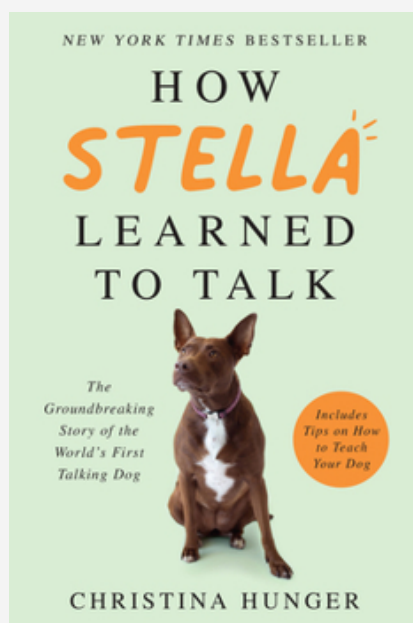

### BOOKS THAT BIND BOOK CLUB

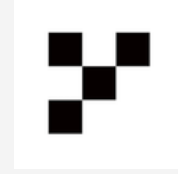

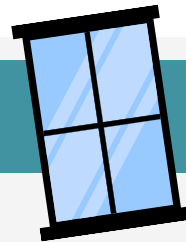

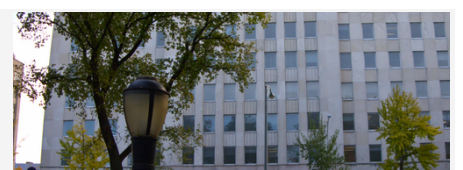

## MISSION MASTERY TIPS & TRICKS FOR NON-PROFITS

### VOLUNTEERS NEED VALUE TOO: RETENTION STARTS WITH APPRECIATION

Many nonprofits focus on recruiting volunteers, but keeping great volunteers is just as important. This July, take time to strengthen the volunteer experience by making people feel seen, appreciated, and connected to the mission beyond the task itself.

Volunteers are more likely to stay engaged when they feel their time truly matters. A simple thank-you, clear communication, or personal connection can turn one-time helpers into long-term advocates. Consider improving volunteer retention this season:

- Share how volunteer efforts directly impacted the mission
- Send quick thank-you emails or spotlight volunteers publicly
- Provide clear roles and expectations before events
- Ask volunteers for feedback after projects or programs
- Create opportunities for volunteers to build community with one another

Strong volunteer relationships build stronger organizations. When people feel valued, they don't just give their time—they invest their hearts in the mission.

Appreciation turns participation into commitment.
